It was all a part of Registration Week.


A novel experience for freshmen new friendships and a fresh sense of independence mingled with a tinge of homesickness.

to succeed.








Student Faculty Reception

But the rain did little to dampen student spirit.



Revising an age-old tradition which excluded women students from the group.




Concertino made their first appearance this year playing in local churches and taking a tour through Washington.



The 1971 cross country season saw the return of Coach Paul Taylor from a two-year absence during which he obtained his doctorate.

The prospects for the year looked dim at the outset as only two of 1970's lettermen were back, due to the fact that ace harriers Don Keller and Doug Money had graduated and several of the top runners of the year before had decided not to turn out.

However, with sophomores Dick Huling and Jerry Harris leading the way, the harriers worked their way to a respectable season.

Freshmen Gary May and Larry Olsen, in their first year of running, joined sophomore Dave Westmark, who had not run since high school. May, particularly, showed outstanding improvement and by the end of the year was pushing Harris for the team's second spot.

Huling had a fine season that included a victory in a meet with C of I and Treasure Valley colleges.

At the district meet in Portland, the team was unable to place but showed promise for a much better season next year. All of this year's team returns plus sophomore Dan Flowers, who sat out this season with a bad back.

Course Evaluation


Course Evaluation constituted a step forward in student voice.

N Club Initiation



The banquet featured all the traditional food complete with pumpkin pie.











Skating Party and Bonfire


December

Holiday Tournament

N.N.C.'s annual classic this year brought College of Idaho, Westminster and Biola to compete with the host Crusaders.

The first game matched the Parsons from Salt Lake City against the Caldwell Coyotes. Behind the scoring of center Scott Bowlden, C of I jumped to a 38-33 halftime lead and maintained that margin for a 84-79 win to gain the finals. Bowlden's 32 points paced a C of I attack that saw the Coyotes shoot a hot 55% from the floor.

In the nightcap, host N.N.C. held off a rought Biola team by 70-66. Dick Luhn's 14 points led a balanced attack that saw Ken Wilde, Denny Johnson and Laird Graham also gain double figures with 13, 12, and 10, respectively. Ron Johnson led all scorers with 23 for the La Mirada, California school.


Westminster and Biola met for the consolation title with Biola breezing to a 74-53 win. After leading by only 39-29 at the intermission, Biola, again led by Johnson, blew it open in the second stanza. Johnson topped the scoring with 19 while Jim Andersen had 16 for Westminster.

In the final, N.N.C., also using a strong second half, bombed College of Idaho with Denny Johnson scoring 20 points and Wilde and Graham getting 18 and 17, respectively. Scott Bowlden came through with another fine showing for C of I, keeping the game close until the final minutes with his 22 points.

"Together - We can work it out" has been the theme of student government this year. Has it worked? Now, as I and the other '71-'72 officers are rapidly becoming "has-beens," it is time to evaluate how well we did in carrying out that theme, to evaluate our effectiveness as leaders, and to make suggestions for next year.

On the togetherness dimension, I feel significant improvements were made in intercampus relations, relations between students and faculty and administrators. However, the degree to which improvement was made was a result of mutual effort. Students respected and trusted faculty and administrators and honestly tried to work within established structures. Faculty and administrators trusted and respected students and placed confidence in the abilities of students. It seems to me that in order for cooperation to continue and increase it will require just such mutual trust and respect on the part of students, faculty, and administrators.

Several significant trends were evident this year, which I believe should be continued. First, student government purposed to operate as a service for students and to provide services. I believe the basic reason for the existence of student government is to represent and serve students. Services such as the book exchange should be continued, hopefully with the addition of more services such as more student employment, as a result of the establishment of the office of Vice President for Community Relations.

Second, our awareness and involvement in the world around us was enhanced through the Issues and Answers series, the National Student Lobby, the Idaho Student Lobby, voter registration, the blood drive and the March of Dimes. I believe we need to continue to be actively involved in the community and world surrounding us both politically and socially. Through the political system and through social service we should be actively trying to improve the condition of mankind.

Third, we have realized through the Nazarene Student Leadership Conference that the Church of the Nazarene through its general leaders is trying to be more attentive to its young people and develop programs to meet their needs. We need to respond by supporting our church and its programs. Admittedly there are changes that need to be made. But only by becoming actively involved in the church can those changes be effected.

This year was a "first" in a number of areas for KCRH. For the first time, artists such as the Carpenters, Lettermen, Engelbert Humperdinck, Ray Conniff Singers, and many more were heard on the air. Another first was achieved when women announcers took over regular weekday shifts. By the end of the year there had been three regular weekday announcers plus a number of others who contributed via the programs Women's World and Broadcast Special.

A "first" in facilities occurred when KCRH was granted additional office space making it feasible not only to initiate a six-man news staff, but also to begin to equip a separate news room/production studio complex. And finally, this was the first year that KCRH could claim to have five announcers who also worked part-time in three different commercial radio stations in the Valley, showing tangible evidence of the high-quality training received from the campus station.

Although it was a year for "firsts", KCRH was continually committed to the ideal of providing "DISTINCTIVE DIMENSIONS IN SOUND" for its listening audience.

Emphases were placed upon total reportage of campus news and events, the exchange of opinion and comment on various issues ranging from campus counseling to women's liberation, and the inclusion of features about and of interest to the campus community.

However, the major emphasis was upon the challenging of the collective mind of the college to act for itself after deliberate reflection, rather than upon the dictating of "how things should be."



out a win, the squad responded with a ine 85-69 victory over Warner Pacific to close out the year.




By tournament time however, the SLA's moved into prominence and upset the mighty SPA's in the semi-finals before going on to defeat the ADP's in finale.



Coach Elmore Vail's 1972 baseball squad suffered a disappointing season with a 7 win, 16 loss record. N.N.C. was outperformed by its opponents in hitting, fielding, and pitching although the Crusaders had some bright individual stars.


Freshman Darrell Tyacke filled an important position at short-stop, seeing that he had to replace last year's star, Ben Maggart. Darrell responded by leading the team in three categories: at bats (80), triples (2), and homers (3).

Junior Dave Boschker was the team's most effective hitter with a .338 average besides leading the team in doubles with 8 and sharing the RBI high of 14 with Bill Campbell, who hit .316, second high on the squad.

Veteran Dale Tindall was the team's swiftest base runner, recording 4 steals during the year and scoring 19 runs.

In the pitching department, Denny Johnson set the pace with the lowest earned run average (2.74), most wins (3), and most strike-outs (33). Terry Irish, unable to complete the season due to a muscle strain, still came up with a respectable 2.92 ERA.


Despite their dismal record, the Crusader diamond crew came up with key wins in the College Classic, downing Weber State, and on Prospective Student Day over tough Idaho State.

TRACK

In 1971, NNC's track team failed to win a meet. In 1972, the squad took two contests by impressive scores. In 1971, only two school records were surpassed. 1972 saw marks go by the boards in no less than six events, two of them twice. The '71 season saw no Crusaders attend District. This year six athletes competed; two of them, Dick Huling and Gary Jeans, earning places with lifetime best performances. All in all, track was easily the most improved of NNC sports teams.

Helping make the season a success was sophomore Dick Huling, the teams leading point scorer and most consistent winner. Dick's best event was the 880 in which he nabbed second spot at the District meet with a school record of 1:54.1.

A strong group of freshman proved invaluable to coach Paul Taylor's forces this year. One of them, Dennis Rabe, came through strongly in the javelin, an event that had been weak for NNC in recent years. Dennis changed all that, however, with a 190-foot toss that cracked the old school mark by over a foot.


Gary Jeans impressed with his consistent quarter-miling, eventually improving his best to 50.8 for a sixth at District.

Although NNC lacked an abundance of returning lettermen, sophomores Steve Wolfe and Roger Schmidt helped take up some of the slack, both beating their own school records from last year. Wolfe, who unfortunately missed District due to an appendectomy, nevertheless triple-jumped 44 feet, 9 inches while Schmidt was pole vaulting 13-8.

The annual NNC invitational was a huge success this year, drawing many top-notch performers. It was also the scene of two more new school marks. First, the 440 relay team of Jeans, junior Dave Mangum, Wolfe and frosh Bob Jackson, legged a 44.2 to nab fourth place although they were only three-tenths of a second behind winner Boise State. Then Huling anchored a sprint medley team of Jeans, Mangum, and Jackson to a victorious 3:35.2 clocking with a fine 880 leg.





Easily earning the title of NNC's most successful sports team, this year's girl netters swept through their season undefeated and came through victorious in the state-wide tournament.



The end of the season saw Fritsch, Chadwick, Vail and Cramer compete in the District tourney in Monmouth, Oregon.


