Haiti

The work of the Church of the Nazarene began officially in Haiti in 1950. Haiti's history has been marked by occupation, oppression, and forced labor, all of which have led to generations of social and political unrest. In 1804, Haiti declared its independence, led by Jean-Jacques Dessalines, and became the first country in the world to be led by former slaves. Once known for the wealth of its natural resources, Haiti is now considered the poorest nation in the Western Hemisphere due to significant corruption. Often the victim of devastating natural disasters like earthquakes and hurricanes, with few resources to meet the needs of its own people, there is a significant diaspora of Haitians in North America and elsewhere. The Church of the Nazarene is a denomination that stays when others are leaving and serves through ministries of compassion when disasters strike.

More than 1,000 Families Receive Food and Tarps in Haiti through Nazarene Compassionate Ministries

In the midst of the pandemic, on August 14, 2021, Haiti suffered another earthquake that devastated much of the country. Dhariana Balbuena, the NCM coordinator, was present to support the Haitian team in organizing and mobilizing a prompt response.

Teams of volunteers worked every night to organize and prepare food parcels that were distributed the next day. "The work did not stop," said Dhariana. "The excellent logistics were allowing us to serve many people every day." This work dynamic allowed more than 1,000 families to receive food packages and tarpaulins to meet physical needs and provide shelter.

Immediately, the Central Field of the Mesoamerica Region and leaders in the Dominican Republic purchased and delivered tarps. Dhariana said, "despite the challenges, and thanks to the fact that we are one church, part of the same family, Nazarenes helped to provide these essentials for recovery and shelter."

Haitian volunteers worked throughout the response efforts, serving their own people. "We praise God for willing people, we have a good team of local volunteers," Dhariana said. Teams of volunteers wore colorful t-shirts they had designed to share joy with those who had lost so much in the gray aftermath of the earthquake. This spirit of joyful service made such a difference in the lives of many. As a result, local media and press agencies came to report on the work being done in these desperate times by Nazarenes. One of the most popular radio stations in Port-au-Prince interviewed the district superintendent of the Haiti South District, Rev. David Eliassaint, who was one of the active volunteers in the response efforts.
