Academics

The goal of Northwest Nazarene College has always been to provide each student with a liberal arts education in keeping with the school's motto of "Seek ye first the Kingdom of God". All programs and activities within the different divisions which make up the academic framework are directed toward fulfilling that goal. The following is a resumé of events which shaped the year for this aspect of the school.

Division of Language and Literature

Among the events which took place in this division were two plays presented by the drama department. Dr. Earl Owens directed *Abe Lincoln in Illinois* which was presented over the homecoming weekend. *Robin Hood*, a children's drama, was directed by Mel Schroeder and was performed during Senior Day activities of the year.

The Speech Department represented the school at several speech and debate tournaments including the Idaho Speech Conference at Boise State College, The Linfield Tournament of Champions, The Big Sky Tournament at the University of Montana, the Pacific Forensic League Tournament at Stanford University, and speech tournaments held at the Idaho State Penitentiary.

The Spanish classes studied excerpts from the earliest writings in Spanish in the Western Hemisphere. Some Spanish Club members, led by Dr. Milton Dean, offered their services and friendship in the Nampa labor camp.

Division of Fine Arts

The College Concert Choir presented the *Messiah* in December and was chosen to appear before the Northwest Divisional Meeting of the Music Educator's National Conference held in Boise, Idaho. Along with their performance of excerpts from Benjamin Britter's *Peter Grimes* for a Boise Opera Workshop, the year was highlighted for the Crusader Choir by their trip to Europe in June. Their tour took them through England, Belgium, Germany, Luxemburg, and Holland.

The Flute Ensemble was also chosen to appear at the MENC in Boise in March. They performed at a woodwind workshop and provided entertainment at one of the MENC banquets.

The Orchestra contributed to the activities of the year by accompanying the *Messiah* performance and the Morrison Hall production, *Trial by Jury*.

The Northwesterners presented their annual Christmas and Spring concerts and also traveled to the Oregon coast third term where they performed for high school audiences, on television and in churches.

Division of Philosophy and Religion

This division sponsored three of the largest organizations on campus that year including Christian Workers Band, Collegiate Ministerial Association and the General Missionary Society.

The division encouraged a trip to Kansas City for all junior and senior students to visit the Nazarene Theological Seminary, and it also acted as advisor for such student activities as the Student Preaching Mission, the annual Theological Program and the annual Senior Sermon contest.

In addition to these activities the division served the church by supplying members to important and official boards of the denomination such as the Orders and Relations Board and the Board of Ministerial Studies.

All members of the division taught, lectured, wrote, counseled and did some preaching in many off-campus situations and for many community and church organizations.

Division of Social Sciences

In view of its continuing rapid growth, the Business Administration Department this year began an evaluative study of its curriculum based in part on the results of a recently completed follow up survey of its graduates. That study may result in a revision of course offerings in business and economics and of major requirements in business administration so that the most recent techniques and procedures in business may be provided for students majoring in this area.

Several members of the History Department attended the Idaho History Conference where Dr. Timothy Smith, professor of history and education at Johns Hopkins University, was the special speaker. The History Department was very proud of one of its majors, John Luik, who was the first graduate of Northwest Nazarene College to receive a Rhodes Scholarship.

The Home Economics Department welcomed the addition of a new faculty member, Miss Roemary Vassar from the University of Idaho. The home economics majors engaged in a project of home management which consisted of remodeling the restrooms in modern accents of black, white and red.

Division of Mathematics and Natural Science

Professor LaVerne Rickard participated with Boise State College in a new program of computer science involving computer test scoring.

A mass spectrometer was built which would facilitate the helium uranium dating of fossils, minerals and meteorites. Prehistoric atmosphere was also studied by measuring the helium content of fossils, minerals and meteorites.

A research grant was received to build a research lab and a proposed research problem was established to study the types of sounds and communications exhibited by several animals. Much data was collected for the study of birds and mammals. A grant was also received from the Research Corporation of New York to carry out an atomic physics experiment which involved the excitation of argon atoms by electron impact.

Division of Education and Psychology

Professor Dene Simpson returned to Northwest Nazarene College as a psychology professor which added the dimension of experimental psychology to the Department of Psychology and the area of Biological Foundations of Behavior to the curriculum.

The State Psychological Association convention was held on campus in April and Dr. Mac Webb attended a work shop in Portland on clinical hypnosis.

A permanent elementary intern program with paid intern teaching positions for elementary majors was developed and inaugurated in the Department Of Education.

The Physical Education Department instituted a program in corrective therapy and a physiology lab was planned.

Learning Resources

The holdings of the library were increased by 3,000 volumes and a \$6,200 grant was received for filling in the back issues of periodicals which will aid in research. Dr. Quanstrom received a grant from the Kellogg Foundation to increase library material concerning the environment.

The Educational Media Center increased its hours to include several evenings and Saturdays for the convenience of the students and faculty. Facilities there include graphics, audiorecording for the individual learning center, sound tracks, a television area, video taping used in student teaching, a projection service and photography.

Interdivisional Programs

The Non-Western studies program, which pursued its Asian studies for the eighth annual year, held a semi-

nar on African Culture for the first time with Dr. Geo. Horner as guest lecturer.

Dr. David Lenefsky and Mr. William L. Oltmans, from New York and Holland, participated in Asian Institute and spoke in Chapel services as well as in informal coffee hours where they talked with numerous students.

Several Faculty members, not directly involved as professors of Non-Western Studies, have contributed significantly to the Asian Studies program. Dr. Double E. Hill, who has traveled in Asia and Europe, spoke on "Music of the Orient". Dr. Percival Wesche who attended an institute

on South East Asia at Hamline University presented a lecture to the class. Marian Washburn, Helen Wilson and Mrs. Ruth Alban each contributed to the program.
